U.S. gasoline price decreases for first time since early February (long version)

The U.S. average retail price for regular gasoline fell for the first time in over three months to \$2.87 a gallon on Monday. That's down 3.1 cents from a week ago, based on the weekly price survey by the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Pump prices were highest in the West Coast states at 3.69 a gallon, down 1.7 cents from a week ago. Prices were lowest in the Gulf Coast region at 2.52 a gallon, down 3.9 cents.
